





THE THEATRICAL LIBRARY OF DR. JOEL E. RUBIN

he Theatrical Library of Dr. Joel E. Rubin is an extraordinary collection of works relating to the Theatre, and especially to the history and practice of theatrical production. The collection is particularly strong in theatre architecture, theatre lighting and scenic design. Formed over 50 years, the collection contains over 2,500 books, pamphlets, trade catalogues, and journals; and an archive of photographs, trade circulars, and related material that reveal insights into the development and production of modern theatre. Subjects include: general theatre history, biography, and study; art reference relating to theatre and theatre-specific artists; fashion and costume; puppets; music; opera; dance; ballet; magic and illusion; lighting design; set and stage design; scenery; theatrical architecture; theatre technology; and works in a variety of languages relating to the national theatres of Russia, Germany (including the former East Germany), France, Hungary, Austria, Italy, Japan, Great Britain, and America.

This is a carefully collected research library by a major figure in the field of lighting design and theatre technology. Dr. Rubin was instrumental in the founding of The United States Institute for Theatre Technology, and International Organization of Scenographers, Theatre Architects, and Technicians. With Leland H. Watson, Dr. Rubin wrote the seminal book *Theatrical Lighting Practice*, published in 1954. This work influenced theatre of the Post-War era by bridging theory and application, and paved the way for a multitude of advances in the lighting profession. In addition, Dr. Rubin's work as Executive Vice-President of Kliegl Lighting and then as Managing Director of Artec Consultants gave him broad opportunities for international travel and to enhance the collection with overseas purchases of materials not available in the United States.

Dr. Rubin's library draws from both historical and theoretical approaches, and combines items relating to the very practical and applied elements within the rich theatrical worlds built by their creators. From studies of lenses for lighting to those of acoustical properties of theatres, from architecture to artifice, the Rubin collection is rich to the scholar and the practitioner. It is the classic "working" library: a rich resource of inspiration and study.

SELECT HIGHLIGHTS



The Rubin Library is exemplary in its breadth and diversity. The many ephemeral and limited works offer a remarkable depth of international material, much of it not readily available in the United States. This is not to say, however, that the collection does not also contain some of the most sought after and commercially valuable works in the field. 
